- Each state or territory has their own requirements for the movement of bees, bee products and beekeeping equipment and penalties may apply for failure to follow legislation.
- All beekeepers must understand their obligations ensuring they hold the correct documentation prior to conducting any interstate movements.

Into VICTORIA Agriculture Victoria PH: 136 186 Agriculture Victoria Website	1. Permits are no longer required for the introduction of bees and hives from any jurisdiction into Victoria. 2. ALL beekeepers seeking to introduce bees, bee products and used beekeeping equipment from any jurisdiction MUST apply for and be granted a Health Certificate

NEW SOUTH WALES NSWDPIRD website: <u>Movement of bees</u>	Hives from ANY State/Territory	There are no restrictions on movement of healthy bees and hives into NSW. Hives, bees or apiary products contaminated, or suspected to be contaminated, with American foulbrood cannot be brought into NSW. Some exceptions apply see <u>Biosecurity Order (Permitted Activities) 2019</u> As per the <u>Code of Practice</u> , beekeepers are required to keep records of details of movements of hives (including swarm catch boxes), including dates, numbers, geographic locations for at least 3 years.
